Board of Education Meeting Summary February 11, 2019

- Meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. •
- The Open Meetings Act was announced and posted in the meeting • room.
- The agenda was approved as published; minutes of the January 14, 2019 meeting were approved as printed.
- The next meeting will be held on Monday evening, March 11th at 7:30 p.m. The annual meeting of the Bluejay Foundation will be held at 7:00 p.m.
- Curriculum reports were presented to the board by Mrs. Wallin (Pre-• school); Mrs. Gaspers (1st Grade); Mrs. Benson (2nd Grade); Ms. Niewohner (3rd Grade); Mrs. Patzel (4th Grade); Mrs. Hanzel (5th Grade); Mrs. Kaufman (6th Grade) and a written report was available from Mrs. Flood (Kindergarten).
- Monthly reports were provided by Theresa Schmedding (Counselor) • and Tim Rossow (Activities Director).
- Principal Barnes reported on K-12 spring parent/teacher conferences and ACT Online Prep, which will be used in classes, but is also something students can log into at any time to practice and study for the ACT. Testing for juniors for the ACT will be April 2nd.
- Superintendent Shalikow reported that the board will not attend the 2019 NRCSA conference in Kearney this year due to hotel limitations; scheduling of a board retreat was discussed; and information was presented about a monument being built on the south side of the north parking lot by the American Legion. No reservations were had by the board on this area being redesigned, as long as the board and administration is kept informed on the design and timeline. Discussion was also had on applying for a clean diesel grant in October of 2019. The board requested we get bids for repairing the 2001 bus from Freightliner Truck Center, Cornhusker International and Kohlhof Trucking before a decision is made.

- Approved Updated Policy 4015-Prohibition Against Employment of • Board Members.

NSCAS Summative Testing and the ACT

The next window for the testing of English Language Arts (ELA), Math, and Science begins on March 18 with the ending date of May 3. Grades 3-8 will take Math and ELA tests while grades 5 & 8 will be taking the Science test. These tests will be spread out during the window of testing with most of the testing taking place in April.

All Juniors or third year high school students will be taking the ACT test, which measures college preparedness, in place of the NSCAS tests. The ACT will be given April 2nd. This test score will count and can be sent to colleges just as the tests that are normally given on Saturdays during the year. This test is given at no cost to the parents and has the same rules and regulations as the Saturday ACT tests. At the school, we have given all those students taking the ACT access to ACT Online Prep which they can work on from any device. Please encourage your student to take advantage of this tool to help them gain a good score. Teachers in some classes will also be using this to address parts of the ACT to help prepare our students to do well. Doing well on this test opens the door to some very good scholarships for your students. A score of 27 or higher on any ACT test taken will also get your name posted on the ACT board at the school.

In order for your student to be prepared for these tests, we ask that, as parents, you encourage your child to get enough sleep and to eat breakfast so they can be fully rested and mentally prepared for the tests. We appreciate your efforts in helping your students and the school perform at the highest level possible.

After receiving an EXCELLENT rating from the State Department of Education this year we want to continue to work hard in order to maintain the quality of education here at Newman Grove School.

Student Reading

Reading allows us to take trips to places we have never been! Encourage your child to read by setting the example for them, taking them to the library, asking questions about what they have read, asking where they want to 'visit' next with a book.

Seniors...where are you in the FAFSA process?

Getting financial aid for college involves more than completing and submitting the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Make sure you get through each step of the process so that you don't miss out on money for college. **Did you complete and submit a 2019-20 FAFSA?** If you haven't, complete the form at FAFSA.gov using 2017 income tax data. Before you start, you and a parent must each get an FSA ID at fsaid.ed.gov. You'll need the FSA IDs to access and sign your FAFSA.

If you DID submit a FAFSA, here's what happens next:

- Expect a Student Aid Report (SAR) via an email link. The SAR acknowledges that your FAFSA was received and lets you know if you need to take further action before the form can be processed.
- You might receive a "verification" notification. The college(s) you listed on your FAFSA may contact you requesting documents to verify information you included on your FAFSA. You must provide those documents before your financial aid can be processed.
- Watch for an award letter from the college(s) you listed on your FAFSA. This will detail the types and amounts of financial aid they are offering you. You must have been accepted for admission before the college will send an award letter.

It's critical that you watch your email and/or student portal carefully to ensure you don't miss important information about admission and financial aid.

What you need to know about scholarships!

Most scholarships are based on academics, but others are based on community service, school involvement, or talent. Some are based on financial need as determined by the results of your FAFSA. Here's where you can find scholarships:

- ScholarshipQuest at EducationQuest.org houses over 2,000 Nebraska-based scholarships. After you create a profile, you'll be matched with scholarships that fit your criteria.
- Your school counselor's office. Visit regularly to check on local and national awards.
- The college you plan to attend. Contact the school for a list of scholarships they provide and application procedures.
- National search sites such as College Board, Peterson's, and Chegg.
- Other resources could include your coach, clubs and organizations, and your parents' employers and civic organizations.

Quick Facts on the Risks of E-cigarettes for Kids, Teens, and Young Adults

What Are E-cigarettes?

- 1. E-cigarettes are electronic devices that heat a liquid and produce an aerosol, or mix of small particles in the air.
- 2. E-cigarettes come in many shapes and sizes. Most have a battery, a heating element, and a place to hold a liquid.
- 3. Some e-cigarettes look like regular cigarettes, cigars, or pipes. Some look like USB flash drives, pens, and other everyday items. Larger devices such as tank systems, or "mods," do not look like other tobacco products.
- 4. E-cigarettes are known by many different names. They are sometimes called "e-cigs," "e-hookahs," "mods," "vape pens," "vapes," "tank systems," and "electronic nicotine delivery systems (ENDS)."
- 5. Using an e-cigarette is sometimes called "vaping" or "JUULing."

Why is Nicotine Unsafe for Kids, Teens, and Young Adults?

- 1. Most e-cigarettes contain nicotine—the addictive drug in regular cigarettes, cigars, and other tobacco products.
- 2. Nicotine can harm the developing adolescent brain.¹ The brain keeps developing until about age 25.
- 3. Using nicotine in adolescence can harm the parts of the brain that control attention, learning, mood, and impulse control.¹
- 4. Each time a new memory is created or a new skill is learned, stronger connections or synapses are built between brain cells. Young people's brains build synapses faster than adult brains. Nicotine changes the way these synapses are formed.
- 5. Using nicotine in adolescence may also increase risk for future addiction to other drugs
- E-cigarette aerosol is NOT harmless "water vapor."
- The e-cigarette aerosol that users breathe from the device and exhale can contain harmful and potentially harmful substances, including:

oNicotine

- oUltrafine particles that can be inhaled deep into the lungs
- oFlavoring such as diacetyl, a chemical linked to a serious lung disease
- oVolatile organic compounds
- oCancer-causing chemicals
- OHeavy metals such as nickel, tin, and $\mathsf{lead}^{\underline{1}}$

It is difficult for consumers to know what e-cigarette products contain. For example, some e-cigarettes marketed as containing zero percent nicotine have been found to contain nicotine.

Common myth believed about vaping, along with the facts.

"It's just flavoring." Vapes get their flavors from chemicals. While these flavorings are safe to eat in food, they're not safe to inhale. Inhaling flavor chemical can harm your lungs" Some buttery-flavored vapes like caramel contain diacetyl and acetoin. Inhaling diacetyl has been linked to popcorn lung, a lung disease that doesn't have a cure."



Although JUUL is currently the top-selling e-cigarette brand in the United States, other companies sell e-cigarettes that look like USB flash drives. They are the MarkTen Elite, a nicotine delivery device, and the PAX Era, a marijuana delivery device

The class did a project on Google Search in which they had to draw the city of Newman Grove. We discussed the history of Newman Grove and the reasons the first town was down by the river. Students then had to use a GPS to locate 4 places that Mr. Amen and I picked out. The class had to video their findings and present the material to the class.

3rd Period- Government- Seniors- We watch CNN 10 every day and they have to write a 4-6 sentence explaining a topic and their opinions on the material of one topic. Doing this during the Congressional election was an especially fun time of the year for the kids. We only had one student that was 18 and was able to vote but all were encouraged to be active in voting. We have finished how the Congress works and their responsibilities and are currently studying the roles of the President. We attended County Government day on October 4th it was a very interesting day. This class is writing a 10-15 page term paper during second semester.

4th Period- World Geography- 10th graders-We watch CNN 10 every day and they have to write a 4-6 sentence explaining a topic and their opinions on the material.
