## Board of Education Meeting May 11, 2015

- Meeting called to order at 7:30 p.m.
- The agenda was approved as published; minutes of the April 9<sup>th</sup> meeting were approved as printed.
- The Treasurer's Report was approved as presented; claims were approved for payment in the amounts of \$32,469.22 (General Fund), \$1,090.90 (Depreciation Fund), and \$8,574.93 (Building Fund).
- Received monthly reports from Guidance Counselor Matt Rudloff and Activities Director Karla Patzel.
- Report by Principal Barnes: Graduation activities, district track and golf schedules, last days of school and staff year-end luncheon.
- Report by Superintendent Shalikow: 2015-16 preschool (over 30 possible), class schedule with 8-period day, and replacement of elementary water fountain.
- Discussed repairs needed on a mini van.
- Accepted quote from Volkman Plumbing & Heating to replace two hanging heaters in the gym.
- Will begin to replace lunchroom tables (3-4 per year).
- Mr. Shalikow will research costs of a replacement building for the red storage shed.
- Discussed replacement of four dumpsters by ag education building with one large dumpster. Mr. Shalikow will check on condition of remaining two dumpsters.
- Discussed upgrades to the gym entry – no action was taken.
- Discussed possible future needs of a summer school program.
- Approved teaching contract of Coby Amen for the 2015-16 school year.
- Approved para educator employment agreement of Kathi McIntyre.
- Approved van driver employment agreement of Al Elznic.
- Two hot lunch employees were present to request additional compensation due to added responsibilities with the hot lunch program.
- Approved the class schedule changes as proposed: daily schedule will be 8:00 a.m. – 3:37 p.m.; added Period 0 to include show choir 2 days per week, providing 5 credits for the year; K-5 music and physical education classes to meet daily, and moving grade 5 students to the junior-senior high school building.
- Approved Rider Classroom Spanish (Levels I and II) for the 2015-2016 school year.
- Approved purchase of 40 HP Stream notebooks for \$8,240. Teachers will be trained on them during the 1<sup>st</sup> semester with student use to begin in 2<sup>nd</sup> semester.
- Entered into Executive Session at 9:17 p.m. to discuss personnel. Return to Public Session at 10:22 p.m.
- The meeting was adjourned at 10:24 p.m.

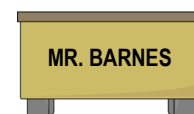

### Summer is upon us!!!

It was an interesting and exciting year at Newman Grove Schools. Our students were successful in multiple areas both academically and athletically. High placings in ISR (Independent Science Research), state qualifier in speech, State Champions in football, state qualifiers in FFA, state qualifiers in track, and the list goes on. We are very proud of the effort put forth by our teachers, sponsors, and coaches throughout the year as they aid the students and athletes in their various pursuits. The students who chose to participate in the various activities offered here at Newman Grove and the amount of time they put into their classes and activities, show that they have a good foundation of values and priorities, which is a reflection of the influence of their parents and families. Thank you all.

There are some changes taking place at Newman Grove Schools for the next school year, 2015-16. The change from a block schedule to a 7 period day with an Access period is perhaps the most obvious change. After doing research throughout the year and talking with other schools of our size that had left the block schedule to return to an 8 period day and determining the educational reasons for that, it was felt we could best serve all of our students by returning to an eight period schedule.

Another change that will be implemented in the upcoming school year will be putting technology in the hands of students as we begin a one-to-one technology program. Students will have access beginning 2<sup>nd</sup> semester to technology that they will be able to take home, if they meet certain requirements, and work on assignments for their various classes.

During this school year a greenhouse was built on the southeast corner of the school with the benefit of generous grants and donations, as well as help from the school board. It has been used this year to benefit the science and agriculture classes in many areas. New classes are being added to the curriculum for this fall as we continue to expand the use of this educational tool.

## SCHOOL IMMUNIZATIONS, PHYSICALS, AND VISION RULES AND REGULATIONS INFORMATION

### HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR CHILDREN ENTERING KINDERGARTEN, 7<sup>TH</sup> GRADE OR FROM OUT-OF-STATE

#### PHYSICAL AND VISUAL EXAMS

These can be done any time between now and the first day of school

- Kindergarten or new students transferring from out-of-state are required to have a physical and visual exam.
- All 7<sup>th</sup> Graders are required to have a physical exam and immunization.
- Please have the physical form and record of immunizations returned to the school by the first day of school or sooner if possible.

#### IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS FOR KINDERGARTEN AND 7<sup>TH</sup> GRADE

Children are required to have:

- 3 doses of Dtap, DT, or Td vaccine with one given on or after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday,
- Tdap booster for 7<sup>th</sup> grade (must contain pertussis booster)
- 3 doses of Polio vaccine,
- 2 doses of MMR vaccine, given on or after 12 months of age and separated by at least one month,
- 3 doses of Hepatitis B vaccine, and
- 2 doses of varicella (chicken pox) vaccine given on or after 12 months of age. Written document including year of varicella disease from parent, guardian, or health care provider will be accepted.

Nebraska State Law states that students **will not** be admitted to school without the minimum immunizations listed here. Waivers will be allowed if your doctor states the child cannot receive a specific immunization. This will have to be on a written form provided by the school and signed by the physician.

#### VISION

Students entering school for the first time, including kindergarten and transfer students from out of state, will be required to provide proof of a vision evaluation taken within six months prior to the student's entrance.

The vision evaluation is required to test for amblyopia (lazy eye) and strabismus (misalignment of the eyes), which are two of the most common vision disorders in young children, as well as internal and external eye health and visual acuity. A certificate or form stating results of the evaluation must be signed by an optometrist, physician, physician assistant, or advanced practice registered nurse.

### IMMUNIZATION CLINIC SCHEDULE

## SUMMARY OF CHILD LABOR LAWS

(Sections 48-301 through 48-313)

All minors under 16 years of age shall not be employed or permitted to work unless the employer first has the minor obtain an Employment Certificate from the school district in which the minor resides.

Minors 14-15 years of age shall not be permitted to work more than 8 hours per day, 48 hours per week, before the hours of 6 a.m. or after 10 p.m.

Minors under 16 years of age may not be employed in any work in which by reason of the nature of work is dangerous to life and limb, or in which the minor's health may be injured or their moral depraved.

## RULE 10 ANNUAL REPORT INFORMATION (2014-2015)

### SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT GOAL

The district began a new cycle of the school improvement process in 2013-2014. The co-chairs of the Continuous Improvement Leadership Team (CILT) are Donna Miller and Erin Forre. Each year the CILT team leads the faculty to specifically analyze testing results to make decisions to drive instruction and programs for students to continue to improve reading skills. This complex process is ever growing and changing based upon the needs of the students.

### STATE-WIDE ASSESSMENT ACCOUNTABILITY

Schools in Nebraska are held accountable for student achievement and progress. No Child Left Behind (NCLB) is a federally mandated law that requires testing of students in grades 3-8 and 11 in the subject categories of Reading, Math and Science to measure student performance. Other measured indicators include writing and graduation rate. All those components are used to determine if schools have met the Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) goal for that school year. To meet the requirements of this law, Nebraska has established a state accountability system called Nebraska Performance Assessment System. Each spring the students of Nebraska are required to take the Nebraska State Assessments (NeSA) to fulfill both of the prior mentioned accountability measures.

Assessment results are published and archived for each school on the state level and can be found on [www.education.ne.gov](http://www.education.ne.gov). When results are made available for public release, Newman Grove Public Schools submits a news article to summarize the results in the local newspaper and district bulletin. Assessment results are typically available in the fall.

### STUDENT PERFORMANCE

The following information has been compiled to show how students of Newman Grove Schools have performed on college entrance exams, achievement tests, and the mastery of basic skills.

#### COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS (A.C.T.)

The ACT Company provides us with a five-year history of our ACT tests (2009-2010 to 2013-2014) and Mr. Rudloff has added our 2014-2015 scores to date.

Table I shows our average composite scores, as well as state and national composite averages. Newman Grove students normally score at or above the national averages and at or slightly below the state averages. Sixty-two percent of our students took the test the past five years with a composite average of 21.1.

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The Class of 2015 has the following scores on the ACT:  
English: 20.2; Mathematics: 20.2; Reading: 22.8; Science Reasoning: 22.7; and Composite: 21.7.

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### ACHIEVEMENT TESTS

The Newman Grove Schools uses the NWEA MAPs test to measure student achievement.

During the 2014-2015 school year, 56-76% of our students scored at or above the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile in the four different subject areas on the MAPs achievement tests. We would expect 50% of the students would score above the 50<sup>th</sup> percentile. We are achieving better than average.

Table II shows the scores for Science, Language Usage, Math and Reading. A score of 68 would mean the score was equal to or better than 68% of the students who took the test nationwide. On a whole, we are achieving higher than "average".

RIT = Rasch unit. RIT scores relate directly to the curriculum scale in each subject area. It is an equal-interval score, like feet and inches, so scores can be added together to calculate class or school averages. RIT scores range from about 100 to 300. RIT scores make it possible to follow a student's educational growth from year to year.

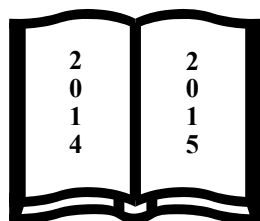
