Board of Education Meeting Summary November 13, 2017

- Meeting called to order at 7:30 p.m.
- The Open Meetings Act was announced.
- The agenda was approved as published: previous minutes were approved as printed.
- The December 11th meeting will be held at 7:45 p.m.
- Curriculum reports were provided by Rob Rose (Social Studies), Theresa Krueger (Special Education) and Donna Miller (Special Education and Title).
- Counselor's report was provided by Matt Rudloff.
- Activities report was provided by Karla Patzel.
- Principal Barnes reported on Veterans' Day program, winter concert rescheduling, kick off to "Beef in Our Schools", random drug testing (with the intent not to catch kids, but to give one more reason for students to say NO), and technology in the classroom.
- Superintendent Shalikow reported on the State Education Conference, up-coming lunch audit, external visit February 6, 2018 focusing on faculty's continuous improvement plan, the start of teacher negotiations, Janet's retirement party, faculty holiday party, automatic deposits after the first of the year and school-day schedule due to state football finals. After discussion with the board, it was decided to call school off on Tuesday AND Wednesday the week of Thanksgiving, giving students and faculty the opportunity to attend the game and enjoy a long Thanksgiving break.

- Claims were approved for payment in the amounts of \$48,743.49 (General Fund), \$1,390.00 (Depreciation Fund) and \$377.58 (Building Fund).

Nebraska Beef In Our School!

What is the program about? The name explains it all in that since Nebraska is a highly agricultural state the Nebraska Beef Council created a program that would more closely tie agriculture to our schools. Mrs. Kylie Sweeter (FFA Instructor) and I took the "bull by the horns" and collected information on how it works and then sent letters to area producers in late September and got instant response. Within a week we had 2 beef donated and 1 hog. We have other beef waiting in the wings for the future when we need to restock the freezers. In doing research on this project it looks like a school of our size could use 8-9 beef per year, since we are partway through the year in starting the program we are hopeful to use about 4-5. It is a great way to support our agricultural community and it is always amazing how much support is out there for our students and schools. This program opens the door to discussing nutrition, agriculture, and economy in our schools.

In order to kickoff the use of local beef in our lunch program on November 15th the FFA students created the hamburgers and grilled them for our entire school! Ms. Bonita Lederer representing the Nebraska Beef Council spoke to the group and the donors of our beef and hog, Mrs. Karen Niewohner and Grandson Graham, representing JSMM Farms, Mrs. Erin Forre, and Mr. Scott Nelson, Mr. & Mrs. Larry Swerczek of Albion Lockers were unable to attend but have been integral in making the program a success.

A big thank you to all those that made the day and introducing the program of Beef in Our School a success.





Wow! How fast does a month fly? It seems like yesterday that the October newsletter was being sent out. On the counseling side of things, this month was very busy with testing, fire prevention, and drug awareness through Red Ribbon week.

The PSAT/NSMQT test was given to juniors. This is a test to qualify for a national merit scholarship. The test is similar to an ACT and gives students another testing experience to help them get ready for the ACT. Juniors also took the ASVAB test. The ASVAB program helps students learn about themselves and potential occupations in line with their skills and interests.

Red Ribbon Week was observed October 23-31. This week was dedicated to educating students about the dangers of drugs and alcohol. Activities during this week included theme days and a poster contest.

Seniors are beginning the application process to colleges. I have sent some transcripts out and seniors are getting the ball rolling. See the key dates for suggestions and helpful hints on where juniors and seniors should be in the process. Seniors get two excused days for college visits and juniors get one. Just send a signed note saying which college your son or daughter will be visiting and they will not be counted absent on that day. If your junior or senior needs another day beyond that, just let us know. Visiting colleges is key in the decision making process. If your son or daughter is struggling in deciding on where they want to go, have them stop in and see me. I can help answer questions and direct them to some tools to help them decide. Again if you have any questions, please contact me and I will help as much as possible.

As November is upon us, and days seem to get even busier, it is good to take time out during the Thanksgiving holiday to spend with family. Remember to reflect on the things you are thankful for and enjoy the time with family.

For instance: Wayne State has a December 1st deadline for scholarships whereas Northeast Community College has a February 1st deadline. If you are not sure what college you are going to attend, apply to all you are considering and apply for all scholarships.

Seniors...a reminder of what to do this fall

There's A LOT going on right now with the financial aid and college admission processes, but don't get overwhelmed! Here's a recap of tasks you should complete this fall to stay on track to college.

- 1. Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- First, create an FSA ID for you and one for a parent at <u>fsaid.ed.gov</u>. You'll need it to access and sign the FAFSA.
- Watch FAFSA Demo video at educationquest.org for an overview of the FAFSA form.
- Review our FAFSA Checklist so you'll know what documents to gather before you start the form.
- Find free FAFSA Tools at EducationQuest.org to help you through the process.
- For free personal help, call EducationQuest to make an appointment: Omaha 888.357.6300, Lincoln 800.303.3745, Kearney 800.666.3721, and Scottsbluff 800.303.3745, ext. 6654.

2. Apply to your top college choices

If you attend one of over 200 Nebraska high schools holding an *Apply2College* events this fall, you'll get help with your applications. If not, no worries... Here are steps you should take to apply. You'll also find a college application checklist listing everything you need.

- 3. Retake the ACT and/or SAT. Colleges use your best scores for college admission and scholarships.
- 4. **Get serious about applying for scholarships.** See <u>ScholarshipQuest</u> at EducationQuest.org for Nebrasks-based scholarships and a list of national search sites.

Juniors...start researching colleges

If you narrow your college choices by the end of your junior year, your senior year will be less stressful. Here's how to get started:

Seasonal Flu shot



Still time to get the flu shot! The seasonal flu shot protects against the three or four influenza viruses that research indicates will be most common during the upcoming season.

Who should get vaccinated this season?

Everyone 6 months of age and older should get a flu vaccine every season.

Vaccination to prevent influenza is particularly important for people who are at high risk of serious complications from influenza. (i.e. Children younger than 5 years of age, asthmatics, diabetics, heart disease, blood disorders, weakened immune systems, and over 65 years of age.)

What are the risks from getting a flu shot?

You cannot get the flu from a flu shot. The risk of a flu shot causing serious harm or death is extremely small. However, a vaccine, like any medicine, may rarely cause serious problems, such as severe allergic reactions. Almost all people who get influenza vaccine have no serious problems from it.

What are the side effects that could occur?

- Soreness, redness, or swelling where the shot was given
- Fever (low grade)
- Aches

Why do some people not feel well after getting the flu shot?

The flu shot can cause mild side effects that are sometimes mistaken for flu. For example, people sometimes experience a sore arm where the shot was given. The needle stick may also cause some soreness at the injection site. Rarely, people who get the flu shot have fever, muscle pain, and feelings of discomfort or weakness. If experienced at all, these effects usually last 1-2 days after vaccination and are much less severe than actual flu illness.
