Dear Beef/Pork Producer,

Newman Grove Schools is again hoping to participate in the "Nebraska Beef in Schools Lunch Program." The concept behind the program is to promote Nebraska Beef in the school lunch program and encourage beef education and nutrition through our school. The number of times beef is served in our lunch program could be increased by instituting this program and students would learn to appreciate the beef cattle industry which is Nebraska's single largest industry.

How does the program work? Producers that are willing to donate a beef at some point during the school year will need to take it to a USDA federally-inspected facility, such as the Albion Locker. The processing of the beef would be taken care of either by donations or by the school. The beef would then be packaged in appropriate sizes and transported to the school.

In researching other schools of our approximate size, it looks like it would take about five to six beef cattle per year. As of last year, over 25 schools in the state were getting involved in the program. Newman Grove had a successful year last year getting the program off the ground with the beef donations from JSMM FARMS-ALBION, BRAD & BECKY WALLIN-NEWMAN GROVE, and HARLAN & DEB JACOBSEN-NEWMAN GROVE. The school and the students truly appreciated the generosity of these donors. It is also possible to work together and split a donated beef with someone else if that works the best for your situation as it still will benefit our students by providing local quality beef (or pork).

With the strong history of the Newman Grove FFA chapter it is evident that the "Nebraska Beef" program could open doors to creating more opportunities for agricultural education such as observation of beef processing and the health benefits of beef.



#### **Questions and Answers**

Information About the Disease And Vaccines

What causes mumps? Mumps is caused by a virus.

How does mumps spread? Mumps spreads from person to person via droplets of saliva or mucus from the mouth, nose, or throat of an infected person, usually when the person coughs, sneezes, or talks. The virus may also be spread indirectly when someone with mumps touches items or surfaces without washing their hands and then someone else touches the same surface and rubs their mouth or nose. Mumps is less contagious than measles or chickenpox.

How long does it take to show signs of mumps? Incubation period of mumps is usually 16-18 days but can range from 12-25 days.

What are the symptoms of mumps? Individuals with mumps usually first feel sick with nonspecific symptom like headache, loss of appetite, and low-grade fever. The most well-known sign of mumps is the swelling of the salivary glands, or parotid glands, below the ear. Others may have respiratory symptoms or symptoms such as headache, loss of appetite, and low-grade fever.

How serious is mumps? In children, mumps is usually a mild disease. Adults may have more serious disease and more complications.

How long is a person with mumps contagious? People with mumps are usually considered most infectious from a few days before until 5 days after the onset of swollen glands. Therefore, CDC recommends isolating mumps patients for 5 days after their glands begin to swell.

What should be done if someone is exposed to mumps? If the exposed person has not been vaccinated against mumps, receiving the vaccine after exposure to the virus will not help prevent disease if the person has already been infected. However, if they did not become infected after this particular exposure, the vaccine may help protect him or her against future infection with the mumps.

At what age should MMR be given? The first dose of MMR should be given at 12-15 months. The second dose is usually given at age 4-6 years but can be given earlier as long as it has been at least 28 days since the first dose. The first dose of MMR should be given on or after the child's first birthday; the recommended age range is from 12-15 months. A dose given before12 months of age will not be counted, so the child's medical appointment should be scheduled with this in mind.

**Do college students need a third dose of MMR?** Not routinely. However, in 2018 CDC recommended that people previously vaccinated with 2 doses of mumps vaccine (e.g., MMR), who are identified by public health authorities as being part of a group or population at increased risk for mumps because of an outbreak, should receive a third dose of MMR.

#### Boone Central/Newman Grove Football



The varsity season started out with a road trip to O'Neill. The Cardinals had a 12-0 deficit Friday night and just as they made a long touchdown run late in the second quarter, the game was suspended by lightning and heavy rain and eventually suspended the game for the evening. At midnight the team loaded up the bus and headed home.

They traveled back the next day to continue the game at 3:00 p.m. The young Cardinals scored first to give them a 13-12 lead but the Eagles answered back at the start of the fourth quarter. O'Neill was able to keep the Cardinals from getting in the endzone by stopping them twice on fourth down attempts with eight and five minutes to play. BC/NG threatened again with just over a minute left in the game but fumbled and that gave the Eagles the 20-13 win.

Monday night, September 2nd, the reserve team traveled to Grand Island to take on the Northwest Vikings. The Cardinals scored first and never looked back. BC/NG had a strong defense and managed to keep the Vikings from scoring till the end of the game. The final score of the contest was 28-8 with the Cardinals earning the win.

On Friday, September 6th the varsity Cardinals hosted the Ord Chanticleers. The Cardinals had the ball first and promptly marched it down the field in 14 plays for the first score of the game. Ryan Kramer's PAT gave them a 7-0 lead. Ord made four first downs and then the penalty flags began to fly. The Chanticleers ended up with a 44 yard field goal to make the score 7-3. The Cardinals went three and out at the end of the first quarter and the Ord receiver returned the punt 31 yards to start their drive on the Cardinal's 34 yard line. Just eight plays into the second quarter, Ord scored to make it a 10-7 contest. Ord dominated the second quarter and made another touchdown to make the game 17-7 going into the half. Second half began with Ord losing possession of the ball after a couple sets of downs. The Cardinals took eight minutes off the clock moving the football down the field. Braden Benes completed a pass to Ryan Kramer to score a touchdown but it was negated due to offensive pass interference. Ord completed a 46-yard pass and followed with a 24-yard run for a touchdown to make it a 24-7 game. The Cardinals continued to battle and scored two additional touchdowns, but the Chants matched each with strong drives of their own. The young Boone Central/Newman Grove team pushed and pushed Ord all night but lost 37-20 against the Class CI 5th-rated Chanticleers.

September 9th the reserve team hit the road again to Norfolk to face the Norfolk Catholic Knights. Our defense worked hard all night and was able to hold the Knights to just a couple of touchdowns and two field goals. The Cardinals were able to score two touchdowns of their own but unable to score the PAT's and were tackled in the end zone when they were given the ball down at the 2-yard line on a Norfolk Catholic punt to give the Knights a safety. The final score of the contest was 22-12 giving the Cardinals their first loss.

The varsity team traveled to Columbus on Friday night to take on the Lakeview Vikings. Second possession of the game and half way through the first quarter the Cardinals scored on a Braden Benes pass to Dylan Korth for 72 yards and a touchdown. They tried a two point conversion but it was no good. Ten plays later, the Vikings score on a 11-yard run with a PAT to make it a 7-6 game. The Cardinals were unable to put together a string of plays to get them in the end zone but Lakeview scored two more touchdowns and extra points before the half to give them a 21-6 lead at the break. The Vikings first possession of the third quarter ended with a fumble recovered by Bryce Kennedy. Unfortunately, the Cardinals were unable to make good of it and turned the football over after the first set of downs. Lakeview turned around and scored just two plays later bringing the score to 28-6. The rest of the game was a defensive battle with the Vikings missing a field goal attempt and giving up a fumble with Bryce Kennedy recovering it to give the Cardinals one more chance to score but unable to finish it before time ran out.

Cardinal reserves hosted the St. Paul Wildcats on Monday, September 16th. Both teams had young freshman quarterbacks and a strong defensive team. The Wildcats out sized the Cardinals but that didn't stop them from getting in the back field to sack the quarterback several times. Both teams threatened to score several times but were held at the final few yards only to be punted back to the other team. St. Paul was able to make it in the end zone late in second half but unable to make the extra point to give them the win 6-0.
